This is my favorite time of year. The change into fall always gets me thinking about cycles and seasons, which always gets me singing that classic song by The Byrds based on Ecclesiastes 3: "to everything there is a season and a time to every purpose under heaven." Our view of nature embodies the first purpose mentioned in the passage: "a time to be born and a time to die." Every year, we see leaves change color as they stop making chlorophyll and fall from the branches. The grass turns brown for the same reason and a season of rest (death) is ushered in with the cooler weather.

The rest of the scripture (and the song) go on to essentially describe what life in the church is like: there is healing, planting, reaping, laughing, mourning, embracing, loss, gain, silence-keeping, a whole lot of talking, love, pain in relationship, and hopefully, peace. These things, like the stages of a grief cycle, do not come in a linear fashion, but seem to stitch themselves in and around the church tapestry like a quilting machine gone berserk. The hope is that those good things, like healing, planting, laughter, embracing, love, and peace are always at the forefront of our common life. We do not, however, live naïve to the fact that the other, less good things come along with what we hope for.

Grief, mourning, loss, pain...they are part of the human package and are part of the life of a community. But even in the midst of all this, we can take another lesson from nature: there is no darkness, death, or anguish that doesn't also hold hope within it. We know from experience that the trees will bloom and flourish again come spring and summer. We know, too, from the experience of our Lord Jesus Christ, that human death also comes with a promise of new life.

As our Stewardship campaign continues, we see the ways this church lives out its faith. As pledge cards come in and are counted, we see how our common life is nurtured so that, even in seasons of rest/hibernation/death, the flickers of hope are still kindled. We are in a season of growth right now and that is exciting. Our finances are getting healthier all the time, and we just might end this year balanced for the second time in a row. We live this life together with all its cycles and seasons so beautifully. Thank you for your continued support, tending to, and care for this church. It is a joy and an honor to pastor and lead you in all seasons of our shared life.

This fall, we give thanks for the faithful Beverly Reese, who has served as our beloved Organist with steadfast dedication and a joyful spirit. After many years of enriching our worship with her music, we were able to celebrate her with delicious food, beverages, and hugs. We extend to her our deepest gratitude for the countless hours she has given and the beauty she has brought to our congregation.

At the same time, we are delighted to welcome Eric Unruh as our new Organist. Eric brings with him a wealth of musical experience and a passion for worship that will continue to inspire and uplift our community. We are also blessed to introduce Emily Sorensen as our new Choir Director. Emily's vision and leadership will guide our choir into a vibrant new chapter, carrying forward the strong tradition of sacred music at St. Mark's. journeying together in faith, fellowship, and music.













How have I experienced the glory and greatness of the Lord in my life?


When and how have I seen the church move in the world in a way it reflects God's love, mercy, justice, or grace?
